PLUS is a registered charity that works across Forth Valley to give children and young people with disabilities the support they need to access and enjoy social and leisure opportunities, with people of their own age. This also gives parents and carers a vital break from caring responsibilities.



We need your support

You can help ensure that **PLUS (Forth Valley) Ltd** is able to continue supporting children and young people with disabilities by setting up a standing order.

Approximately 63% of PLUS's financial support is directly from Stirling Council. In 2013-2014, there was a 5% reduction to this income, with an expectation that PLUS will continue to deliver the same quality service. Trusts and Grant funding is proving more and more difficult to secure due to a high levels of competition from charities and other organisations seeking funding. PLUS needs to look at new ways to secure additional income to continue to provide a high quality service to children and young people with disabilities across the Forth Valley.

A<u>n example of decreasing funding: (although likely to affect all projects and services)</u>

Without additional support / funding there is potential for the Bank Project to be withdrawn in 2014, or be delivered in a reduced way. The Bank Project supports 40 young people aged 18 - 25. Losing The Bank Project will be a devastating blow to these young people and their families and it will result in the majority of the young people becoming socially isolated out with the family unit.

Examples of how projects and services may be effected without additional financial support?

Less monthly activities available Less community based activities Staff redundancies Less resources available Less sessions available to individuals Full recovery of transport / no transport Limited training for staff

Some children /young people excluded if no social worker/care plan in place Families contribute toward events/travel/staffing

What are PLUS doing to secure additional funds?

In March 2013 PLUS employed a full-time Fundraising Coordinator who has been working on various projects to generate income; securing grants from 2014 Communities, Silvia Wadilove Charitable Trust and Postcode Lottery, identifying the resources and funding to turn our outdoor space into a sensory garden and play area, organising and running PLUS fundraising events, raising PLUS' profile by becoming Charity of the Year for Sainsburys, Active Stirling and Yorkshire Building Society, and recently securing funds to start a dedicated Sensory Room.



We need more people to get involved in fundraising perhaps by running events in the community or through your workplace to raise money for PLUS.

Get in touch and we will give you our booklet of fundraising ideas to get you started! We would like to encourage everyone to set up a standing order to secure longer-term funding and help PLUS plan vital projects and support for the future.

1. Set up a monthly donation to PLUS (Standing Order Form on reverse)



- A donation of £5 per month would enable a staff member or volunteer to attend a half day training course for autism.
- A donation of £6 per month would finance the costs involved for a 4 hour session for a young adult aged 18 35
- A donation of £10 per month would cover the costs of a young person to attend an event. This includes: venue costs, staff and costs of materials.
- A donation of £20 per month would cover the cost of one teenager to attend our after school group for 2 school terms.

As well as setting up a Standing Order you can...
