Age: 5-10 years old

Plav PLUS provides support for children to attend holiday, weekend and evening play activities. A focus is placed on venue-based play and social opportunities, with a wider range offered during summer, including soft play, swimming and trips out.

Age: 11-17 years old

Referrals: A formal referral is **not** required, unless the child has a Social Worker or is linked to the Children with Disabilities Team. Parents can contact PLUS directly to find out more information about our services. Eligible families will be asked to meet with PLUS to complete paperwork during a home visit. Once this information has been collated and approved by the family, the child can start attending.



Age: 5-17 years old

Count Me In supports young people to access mainstream groups across Stirling, for example, Youth Clubs, Scouts, Guides, Brownies or Sports Groups.

The project aims to increase the capacity of organisations to work inclusively by providing information, advice, training and practical help, though the support of PLUS volunteers.
